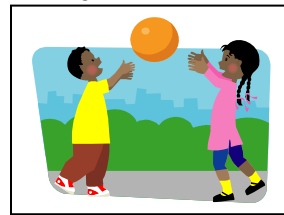
Story times are held on Fridays at 10am.

SPRING CLEAN UP - MAY 16, 2011

A special spring clean up will be held Monday, May 16, 2011. Any item's residents wish to have picked up must be placed at roadside. Please be sure to have items at the curb early, as pick up can commence anytime after 5:00 a.m.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE- MAY 18, 2011

The Mobile Household Hazardous Waste Recovery Unit will be at the Salisbury Municipal Building parking lot on Wednesday, May 18, 2011 from 2:00-7:00 p.m. Bring your household hazardous wastes for safe disposal. These are products such as solvents, pesticides, and chemicals.

PESTICIDE USE

Council are again asking for everyone's cooperation in reducing pesticide use in the village by using nontoxic methods of maintaining green spaces.

LIGHTING OF DRY GRASS AND OPEN FIRES

By-Law 40 states:

- The lighting of any open fire to dispose of dry grass, brush, hay, straw, leaves, buildings, construction materials, automobile or garbage in the municipality is prohibited.

- Other than in a properly constructed incinerator approved by the Department of Environment and Local Government and its successors, no person shall light a fire outside a building for the purpose of disposing of any refuse or waste material.

DOG TAGS

New Brunswick Society for the Prevention of Cruelty of Animals will be our 2011 Animal Control Officers for the Village of Salisbury. They have been authorized by the Village council to sell dog tags door to door. Dog tags are also available at the Village Office. **A \$15.00 penalty will be added to the regular registration fee for tags not bought by March 31st and a \$50.00 penalty will be added to the regular registration fee for tags not bought by June 30th.**
