HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE - October 19, 2011

The Mobile Household Hazardous Waste Recovery Unit will be at the Salisbury Municipal Building parking lot between the hours of 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. **Wednesday, October 19, 2011**. Bring your household hazardous wastes for safe disposal. These are products such as solvents, pesticides, and chemicals.

NOTICE TO HUNTERS

Please be advised that it is an offence under Village By-Law No. 22 to be involved in the act of hunting within the municipal boundaries of the Village of Salisbury - **VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.**

LIGHTING OF DRY GRASS AND OPEN FIRES

By-Law 40 states: The lighting of **any open fire** to dispose of dry grass, brush, hay, straw, leaves, buildings, construction materials, automobile or garbage in the municipality **is prohibited**. Other than in a properly constructed incinerator approved by the Department of Environment and Local Government and its successors, no person shall light a fire outside a building for the purpose of disposing of any refuse or waste material.
